

A few tips can make parking quicker and easier

P Short Stay Parking
 At busy shopping times (Saturdays especially) the most popular car parks (right in amongst the shops) fill up quickly; so instead of queuing (and holding up other drivers), save yourself time and trouble by coming early or parking just a bit further out: most outer car parks are only a 5 minute walk from the shops (and tend to be cheaper too).

If you're just passing through central Leeds, use the Inner Ring Road system to bypass the City Centre.
