MS. 421

The Leeds General Cemetery was established in 1833 as a joint stock company, to provide and maintain a burial ground in Leeds. The site chosen was St. George's Fields near Woodhouse Moor, on high ground to the north-west of the old town centre, close to the road to Headingley and Otley. The cemetery was supported by many wealthy notables of Leeds, especially non-conformists. In the 1930s it was becoming clear that the ground would not last much longer and that the enterprise would cease to be viable. By the end of the Second World War, the cemetery had become rather overgrown and neglected. After some controversy, the University of Leeds, whose site and buildings had nearly surrounded the cemetery, acquired the Company in 1956, and subsequently obtained powers under the provisions of the University of Leeds Act (1965) to landscape the site. In accordance with the provisions of the Act, the University contacted all known owners of burial plots, and supplied documents enabling them to request compensation.

A photographic record of the inscriptions on tomb-stones in the cemetery was made by Mr Edmund Williamson, then Bursar of the University, before it was landscaped. Unfortunately the copy held by the University architects was destroyed by fire in the 1970s, while the set of negatives deposited with the Registrar General in London, in accordance with an agreed interpretation of the relevant clause in the Act, cannot currently be located.

A history of the Company was the subject of a thesis for the degree of MPhil in the University of Leeds, submitted by Mr R E Fletcher in 1975. A copy may be consulted in the Brotherton Library. That thesis included a provisional and partial list of the archives of the Company, and the numbers in square brackets after entries in the present Handlist, refer to the numeration in Mr Fletcher's list. The order of items in this Handlist, especially in section III, is neither strictly chronological nor entirely systematic. This reflects the numbering and muddled contents of the various bundles and boxes as preserved in Mr Fletcher's list, though some attempt has been made here to bring a little order to groups of items bearing the same number in his list. The appended concordance summarises those changes. It is hoped that the index will enable searchers to overcome these difficulties.

The papers were acquired by the University when it purchased the Company. They were transferred to the Brotherton Library in batches in 1977 and 1978.

The Brotherton Library has an alphabetical list of persons interred in the cemetery. This serves as an index to the burial registers. The registers may be inspected on Mondays to Fridays during normal office hours, but are not available for consultation on public or university holidays, current details of which may be found in the University of Leeds Calendar.

Chronology

1833 – The Joint stock company was established. £10,000 was raised locally to cover construction work, e.g. building the boundary walls, building the Chapel etc.

1930s- The Company became much less profitable. There were closure threats in 1928 and 1937.

1950s - The cemetery was nearly full, some of the graves had become neglected and it was in a general state of disrepair.

1956 - The University of Leeds acquired the majority shareholding in the Company.

1965 - The University of Leeds Act was passed. This was private legislation which empowered the University to create a public open space by the removal of headstones and other memorials; and the prevention of further interments after October 1965.

1967- The Company went into voluntary liquidation in October 1967.

1968- From March-November, contractors removed headstones and memorials, (though some were collected by the City Museum, some retained and others covered over). The area was then grassed over and landscaped. The Chapel was designated of special architectural and historical interest and remained in place. There were no exhumations.

1969-Burials eventually ceased in October 1969. Between the opening of the cemetery in 1835 and the closure in 1969, a total of **93,569** interments had taken place.

1969- In the autumn, the area was re-opened to the public, under the name of **Saint George's Fields**, (which had been the original name before the site had been cemetery).

Appendix 2 - Chronology of Leeds General Cemetery Company

1833 - Joint stock company established. £ 10,000 raised locally to cover construction work, e.g. building the boundary walls, building the Chapel etc.

1930s- The Company became much less profitable. There were closure threats in 1928 and 1937.

1950s - The cemetery was nearly full, some of the graves had become neglected and it was in a general state of disrepair.

1956 - The University of Leeds acquired the majority shareholding in the Company.

1965 - The University of Leeds Act was passed. This was private legislation which empowered the University to create a public open space by the removal of headstones and other memorials; and the prevention of further interments after October 1965.

1967- The Company went into voluntary liquidation in October.1 967.

1968- From March-November, contractors removed headstones and memorials, (though some were collected by the City Museum, some retained and others covered over). The area was then grassed over and landscaped. The Chapel was designated of special architectural and historical interest and remained in place. There were no exhumations.

1969-Burials eventually ceased in October 1969. Between the opening of the cemetery in 1835 and the closure in 1969, a total of 93,669 interments had taken place.

1969- In the autumn, the area was re-opened to the public, under the name of Saint George's Fields, (which had been the original name before the site had been cemetery).

Plot ownership: background information

In accordance with the provisions of the 1965 Act, the University contacted all known owners of burial plots, and supplied documents enabling them to request any or all of the following: 1) a photograph of the family grave 2) arrangements for burial after 1965 3) compensation for loss of burial rights 4) compensation for termination of the maintenance agreement 5) notice of the intention to remove a memorial.

Before the landscaping began, a complete photographic record of the monumental inscriptions was made by Mr E. Williamson, who was Bursar at that time. The negatives were deposited with the Registrar General, as was required by an agreed interpretation of the relevant clause in the Act.
