### **Freedom of Information Response (Our Ref: K/20/376)**

Thank you for your Freedom of Information (FOI) request dated 28 September 2020, reference K/20/376.

Your request read:

“In respect of each of the LLB core modules / subjects required for a Qualifying Law Degree from the University (“the foundations of legal knowledge”):

- (i) the average final mark awarded to candidates in 2018
- (ii) the average final mark awarded to candidates in 2019
- (iii) the average final mark awarded to candidates in 2020
- (iv) the percentage of candidates awarded a final mark of 40% or above in 2018
- (v) the percentage of candidates awarded a final mark of 40% or above in 2019
- (vi) the percentage of candidates awarded a final mark of 40% or above in 2020

Please note: where assessment consists of different components (eg assignments and examinations) the 'final mark' is the aggregated, weighted mark awarded for the module / subject.”

The University of Leeds holds some of this information. There is no average mark for 2019/20 for Contract, Constitutional or Criminal Law as they were marked on pass/fail basis this year due to the changes to assessment made because of coronavirus arrangements.
